
Jesus Forgives Sins




Then one of them said, "Let's lower him down through the roof!" So they carried the man up to the roof and dug a big hole in it.



Then they lowered the paralyzed man down into the room right in front of Jesus!




When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the man who was paralyzed, "My son, your sins are forgiven."
