
The Rich Young Ruler



Jesus had now finished his work in Galilee and had come to Judea, on the other side of the Jordan. The crowds came to him there, and as usual he taught them.








The young man replied, "Teacher, I've obeyed these laws ever since I was just a boy." And Jesus looked at the young man and loved him.




But Jesus said, "There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you have and give it to the poor—then you will have treasures in heaven. Then come and follow me."



When the young man heard this, his face fell. He got up and went away sadly, because he was very rich.




Jesus looked around and said, "How hard it will be for those who are rich to enter the kingdom of God!"



The disciples were shocked at these words. Jesus added, "It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God."




They were very surprised. "Then who can be saved?" they asked. Jesus looked at them and said, "With men it is impossible, but not with God. For God, all things are possible."
