


## **Bartimaeus and Zacchaeus**



**1** Once when Jesus was leaving Jericho, a great crowd was following him. He came upon a blind man named Bartimaeus, who was begging beside the road.










6 Instantly Bartimaeus could see! He followed Jesus down the road, giving thanks to God. The crowds who saw this also praised God.
