
## The Last Supper




That evening, as the Passover meal was being served, Jesus got up. He took off his outer cloak and wrapped a towel around his waist.




He then poured water into a bowl and began to wash the disciples' feet, drying them with the towel at his waist.




When he came to Peter, Peter said, "Lord, you shall never wash my feet!" But Jesus replied, "Unless I wash you, you have no part with me."




"Then not just my feet, Lord," Peter said. "Wash my hands and my head, too." Jesus said, "A person who has had a bath needs only his feet washed."



When he had finished washing their feet, Jesus put his cloak back on and returned to his seat. "Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked.





"No servant is greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them."






