
Jesus Before the Sanhedrin

The counsel wanted to find witnesses who would testify against Jesus so that they could put him to death. But the witnesses' testimony did not agree.




Finally two stood up and spoke against Jesus. "We heard him say, 'I will destroy this temple made with hands and in three days I will build another not made with hands."


The high priest tore his garment and said, "Why do we need other witnesses? You have heard his blasphemy! What is your decision?"




Some began to spit on him. Others covered his face and struck him and said, "Prophesy to us, you Christ. Who hit you?"
