
The Crucifixion of Jesus

3 A man named Simon, who was from Cyrene, happened to be passing by at that time. The soldiers made Simon carry Jesus' cross.




2 Finally, they took off the purple cloak and put Jesus' own clothes back on him. Then they led him out to crucify him.



4 They brought him to the place called the Skull (Golgotha). There they nailed Jesus to the cross and raised it up. It was about nine o'clock in the morning.




The soldiers gambled to see who would get his clothes.

The people who passed by made fun of Jesus. They said, "You claimed you would destroy the temple and build it in three days! Save yourself and come down from there!"




At about twelve o'clock, darkness came over the whole land. It lasted for three hours.



10 Then at about three o'clock, Jesus cried with a loud voice, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Not long after that, Jesus gave a loud cry and died.



12 When the centurion who stood facing Jesus saw how he died, he said, "Surely this man was the Son of God!"
