
The Disciples Share


All the believers felt very close to one another. Each shared his possessions with the others. There was no one among them who had to do without food or clothing or a place to sleep.






Peter said to Ananias, "How is it that Satan has caused you to lie to the Holy Spirit and to keep for yourself some of the money you received for the land?"
