




Peter said to them, "You know that it is against Jewish law for me to visit with Gentiles. But God has shown me that I should not call any man 'unclean."

So Peter preached to these people about Jesus, telling them about the forgiveness of sins for those who believe in Jesus.




As he was preaching, the Holy Spirit came on those who listened. They began to speak in tongues and praise God. The Jewish Christians who had come with Peter were amazed.
