


Peter Escapes from Herod



King Herod arrested some of the believers in Jerusalem. He had even had the apostle James, the brother of John, put to death with a sword.






While Peter was in prison, chained between two guards, members of the church were praying earnestly for Peter at the house of Mary, the mother of John Mark.





"Follow me," the angel said. So Peter followed him out of the prison. He thought he was dreaming. They passed the guards and came to the iron gate. It opened up by itself!




After walking with Peter for a short distance, the angel disappeared. At last Peter realized that the Lord had sent an angel to rescue him from Herod.



So Peter went to the house of Mary, the mother of John Mark, where the believers had gathered to pray for him.






The other believers said to Rhoda, "You're out of your mind!" But she kept insisting, so they said, "It must be his angel." Peter kept on knocking.
