
## **The Second Journey Begins**


**5** They traveled from town to town and encouraged the new Christians. The church grew in faith and numbers every day.




6 Paul and those with him traveled through the region of Phrygia and Galatia. But the Holy Spirit kept them from preaching the word in the province of Asia.


## Acts 15:36-16:15

**9** Because of Paul's vision, his group concluded that God wanted them to preach in Macedonia. So they made preparations to leave at once.




B During the night, Paul had a vision. He saw a man of Macedonia standing and begging him, "Come over to Macedonia and help us!"



**10** They sailed from Troas to Samothrace and then to Neapolis. From there they went on to the main city of that area of Macedonia—the Roman colony of Philippi.



When the Sabbath arrived, they went outside the city to a river, where they found a Jewish place of prayer. They sat down and began to speak to the women who had gathered there.



**12** One of these was Lydia. She sold purple cloth and was from Thyatira. The Lord opened her heart and she and all her household were baptized. Lydia invited Paul and his group to stay at her home.
