
Paul Reaches Jerusalem





"I am ready not only to be tied up but also to die in Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus." So they gave up and said, "The Lord's will be done."




When they heard these things, they praised God. Then they said to Paul, "There are many Jews who have believed in Jesus. All of them are zealous for the law of Moses."




"Four men have made a vow. Join them in their purification rites and pay their expenses. Then all will know that you yourself live in obedience to the law."
