
## From Malta to Rome

The chief official of the island, Publius, invited them to his house for a few days. While there, Paul healed the father of Publius, who was sick with a fever.




Then the rest of the sick on the island came and were cured. The people honored Paul in many ways. After three months, they gave the shipwrecked men the supplies they needed to sail on.



Finally Paul reached Rome. After three days, he called together the leaders of the Jews. He said: "My brothers, I have done nothing against our people or our customs."




"But I was arrested in Jerusalem and turned over to the Romans. They did not find me guilty of any crime deserving death and wanted to release me. But the Jews objected."
