
John Prepares the Way

Then John began to preach to the Jewish people. He went throughout the whole area around the Jordan River, saying, "Turn away from your sins and be baptized, and God will forgive you."






"You bunch of snakes! Don't think you can escape punishment just because you are descendants of Abraham! God could take these rocks and make them into descendants of Abraham!"
