


Jacob Tricks His Brother



Isaac was now very old and blind. He decided that before he died he would give his final blessing to his firstborn son Esau.




Isaac asked Esau to kill some game so that he could prepare his father's favorite food. After Isaac ate the meal, he would give his final blessing.

After he ate the food Jacob brought, he had his son come close so that he could kiss him. Then he could smell Esau's clothes which Jacob wore.




So he blessed Jacob, thinking he was Esau. He prayed that God would make him wealthy and a powerful ruler over his brother and his relatives.




After Jacob left, Esau returned. When he asked his father for the blessing, Isaac realized he had blessed someone else. He began to tremble and shake.
