
Joseph in Egypt




After his brothers sold him to slave traders, Joseph was taken to Egypt. There his situation got even worse.




When the slavers arrived in Egypt, they sold Joseph to Potiphar, who was captain of the bodyguard of the king, or Pharaoh.




3 God gave Joseph a special talent for organizing his work well. Because of God's blessing, everything Joseph tried to do, he did well.



Joseph was young, strong, talented, and goodlooking. But trouble would not stay away!




Potiphar was so impressed with this young slave's abilities that after a while he made Joseph manager over his entire household. Joseph was even in charge of much of Potiphar's business!



6 About this time, Potiphar's wife began to notice what a fine young man Joseph was. She began to pay lots of attention to him.


Genesis 39
