
The Israelites Leave Egypt

There was not one home in Egypt in which a son had not died. But the Lord did not harm the first-born sons of the Israelites, who had marked their doorposts with blood.







The Israelites set out on foot. There were about 600,000 men, not counting the women and children. They also took their animals and many other people with them.




The Israelites had lived in Egypt for 430 years. On the day the 430 years ended, all the tribes of the Lord's people left Egypt.
