


The Spies Sent to Canaan




The Lord spoke to Moses in the wilderness of Paran: "Choose a leader from each of the tribes and send them to explore the land of Canaan, which I have promised to give them."




The spies returned after exploring the land for forty days. "The land is rich and fertile," they said, "but the people there are strong and their cities are well fortified."

Moses chose twelve men and said to them, "Find out how good the land is and how strong the people are. Find out if their cities are fortified." Then he sent the spies on to Canaan.




However, one of the spies, Caleb, said, "We should attack now and take the land. We are strong enough to conquer it." Ten of the spies said, "No, the people there are too powerful."







Moses prayed, and the Lord changed his mind. But God said, "None of the unfaithful will live to enter the land. You will wander around for forty years, until the last of you is dead."




When the people learned what the Lord had said, they decided to leave right away for Canaan. Moses warned them, saying, "The Lord will not be with you. You will die in battle."
