

## Sin Enters the World

Now the serpent was the most tricky of all the animals on the earth. The serpent asked Eve, "Did God really say that you must not eat from any tree in the garden?"




But the serpent said, "That's not true! You won't die! God just said that because he knows that when you eat it you will be like him, knowing good and evil."

Then God said to the serpent, "As punishment, from now on you will have to crawl on your belly in the dust. And your kind will be the enemies of people forever."




To Adam God said, "You will have to work hard and sweat to make the ground produce enough food. You will work until you die. You were made from the dust of the ground and you will become dust again!"
