
The Battle of Jericho


Each day for six days Joshua and his men marched around Jericho one time, making no sound except for that of the rams' horn trumpets.


But on the seventh day they got up at daybreak and marched around the city seven times! On the last time around Joshua said to his men, "Shout! The Lord has given you the city!"

Only Rahab and her family were spared. The two spies went to the house with the red cord tied to the window and led out Rahab and her family to a safe place. Thus they kept their promise to her.




