Samson and Delilah




Delilah was a Philistine woman from the valley of Sorek. Samson loved her, though the Philistines were his enemies.






The Philistine kings held a celebration to offer a sacrifice to Dagon, their god, for giving them victory over Samson. The temple was packed with about 3,000 men and women.
