On arriving at the Israelite camp, David was surprised to find everyone afraid to fight the giant who challenged the army of the living God. So he said, "I will go and fight him myself."




One of the Philistines was a giant named Goliath. He was over nine feet tall and wore heavy bronze armor. His spear had an iron point that weighed fifteen pounds.

"You come with a sword and spear," David replied, "but I come in the name of the God of Israel. Today everyone will see that the Lord does not need swords or spears to save his people!"




Then David ran to where Goliath had fallen to the ground and, using the giant's own sword, cut off his head!
