

Saul Is Jealous

3 But Jonathan, Saul's son, loved David very much. Jonathan promised David that he would be his friend forever. He even gave David his robe and sword and other weapons.




5 Later Saul made David commander in the army, hoping he would be killed in battle. But David was a good leader, because the Lord was with him. Everyone but Saul liked David.



2 King Saul became angry when he heard them praising David. He thought to himself, "They are praising him more than me. Next they will want to make David a king." Saul was very jealous.




One day as King Saul listened to David play his harp, an evil spirit took control of the king. He tried to kill David with his spear. However, David jumped out of the way and was not hurt.
