
King David Shows Kindness



King David ruled over all of Israel and made sure that his people were always treated fairly and justly.




One day David asked, "Is there anyone from Saul's family still living? If so, I would like to show him kindness for Jonathan's sake."



But not all of David's efforts to be kind turned out so well. When the king of Ammon died, David said to his servants, "I will show friendship to the king's son just as the king did to me."




So he sent messengers to express his sympathy to the king's son. But the leaders said to the king's son, "David did not send these messengers to express sympathy! They have come to spy on us!"
