
Elijah and the Widow

God told Elijah to go to the brook Cherith. There, just as God had promised, the ravens brought him food every morning and evening. But soon the brook dried up, for there had been no rain.




When Elijah got to Zarephath, he saw a widow gathering firewood near the town gate. He asked her for a drink of water and some bread.
