
Joash the Boy King



Then the people went to the temple of Baal and tore it down. They destroyed the altars and broke the idols into pieces. They killed the priest of Baal in front of the altars.




After several years, Joash decided to repair the Lord's Temple. He ordered the priests to collect money for making the repairs. But many years passed and still no repairs were made.



This money was used to pay the carpenters and stonemasons and metal workers who made the repairs on the Temple. Before long, the Temple was strong and beautiful as before.




