
Menahem, for example, became king of Israel by killing King Shallum—who had killed the king before him. Menahem was king for ten years but he did nothing to turn his people from their sins.



When Menahem died, his son Pekahiah became king. After ruling for only two years, Pekahiah was murdered by Pekah, who became the next king.




After that, Pekah was killed by Hoshea, who then became king. During his reign, the new king of Assyria, Shalmaneser, attacked Israel.
